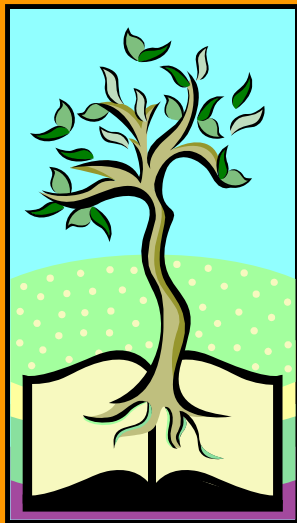

CBI Knowledge Bowl



The Knowledge Bowl Program will be available for purchase. This year acquisition of the program will be done by download from the CBI website. No CDs will be available. The process is simpler and much faster than using snail mail.

Step 1: Complete the order form found on the CBI web page (www.cbiohio.com). Please be sure to include a PO# with the order

Step #2: Email the completed form to me at vsnow@fourcounty.net

Step #3: I will email you the download passcode and access code

Step#4: Go to www.cbiohio.com and click on the Knowledge Bowl icon and follow the download prompts

It's that easy!

Here are some other changes to note.

All categories have been updated with 5-10 new questions

Minor changes in the quiz making section has allowed one step to be eliminated, speeding things up a little

In the contest section, when several categories are selected more questions of the categories can be pulled up, i.e. a contest including History, Geography, and Our USA can now generate around 96 questions from each category

BONUS FEATURE: Every purchased program will include three pre/post multiple choice tests in the areas of: Related, Social Studies, and English and may be used at your discretion for SLO development. The tests have been created from assorted, State approved, Knowledge Bowl category questions

Price structure has changed:

\$50.00 per Coordinator

\$45.00 per Coordinator from school purchasing **3 or more** programs

The price increase is a result of several factors; first we eliminated the need for additional programs by permitting several downloads per purchase. We have included the three pre/post tests for SLOs and we are working on converting the program to make it compatible with both Windows and Mac products. (If you only have access to Mac products and are interested in participating in Knowledge Bowl, please contact Vickie Snow.)

There has been a trend to make Knowledge Bowl questions more detailed and complex. This gives the instructor opportunities for "teachable" moments while developing the soft skills of team building and leadership. Many questions have been generated from high-stakes practice tests. Students learn and have fun competing. Vickie Snow has participated in Knowledge Bowl and finds it to be a positive experience. "Most years I have former students return around Knowledge Bowl time to talk about their experience and maybe answer a few of the questions. Over the years of participation in the program I have witnessed its profound and lasting effect on my students!" said Snow.

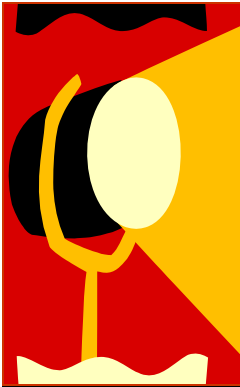

This weekend 8 Dempsey CBI students and 10 BV CBI students gave of their Saturday (yes the opening day of fair...this was a BIG deal!) to pack rice based meals for hungry Haitian children down at OSU football stadium. What an experience this was! For many, a once in a lifetime opportunity!

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Students were "decked out" with their OSU dress attire and buckeye necklaces for the event. As kids boarded the bus paid for by the Delaware Area Career Center, they had a taste of yummy buckeye treats! When the students were dropped off at the stadium, they were able to walk around 1/2 of the stadium and check out the grounds of college life. Nickki Wright and her colleague were able to point out important buildings near the stadium and the dorms. After seeing the 15 story dormitory one student responded, "I would want to stay in the pent house in that dorm!"



As students entered gate 31, they were given a UVS Hunger t shirt at registration. The \$10 registration for each student was paid out of the CBI club account from fundraisers in the past. Students sat through a 10 minute video presentation about Haiti and the poverty in that country followed by a how to video for the actual meal packing.



Students then chose a station to begin packing meals. Families in Haiti send a representative once a week to pick up 5 meals for the entire week to feed the entire family. At school, this is what children are fed every day. The bagged meals consist of rice, soy, chicken flavoring, and dried vegetables. The bags are then weighed for shipping, sealed, and packed in a box. After an hour of packing hundreds of meals, it was time to visit the stadium!

The CBI students were the first ones on the field. The kids were in awe as they looked around the stadium and couldn't believe how big it was. One of the students was given a disposable camera from his mother, I just listened to the many clicks of the camera! Many of the kids didn't know what turf was, so we made them sit down and feel it. They were given the okay to go to the 50 yard line to take photos as well. While standing in the student section of the bleach-

Students Honor Fallen During Nation Day of Service Remembrance

In honor of the National Day of Service in Remembrance of 9/11 students enrolled in the Career Connections program at Dempsey Middle School went to Oakgrove Cemetery in Delaware. They were taken to the oldest part of the cemetery where it was explained how teens had vandalized the headstones. Their task was to dig trenches and reset the heavy headstones.

On the drive back to Dempsey Nicki Wright, coordinator of the program, said it was great to hear the kids comment about how stupid people are that they would go to a cemetery to vandalize a headstone. They were stating how disrespectful it is. Doing service projects like coming to Oakgrove helps to give these kids a bit of perspective and allows them to do GOOD for someone else, something many of them often

don't do!

Wright was also impressed that students never complained about doing the hard labor work asked of them. After their trip was cut short by an hour due to the storm Wright was asked numerous times, "When are we going back?" and comments such as, "I'm mad we didn't get to stay there longer," and "There was still so much more work we needed to get done!" "This is music to my ears." said Wright.
