

Regions at a Glance

Region 12

Seth Lee, a member of the West Branch High School Career Based Intervention (CBI) program won first place in the "18 and Under Class" of the OMB Warehouse Mini Bike Build-Off this year. Each year participants from all over the United States, Europe, and Australia compete against one another to see who can build/restore the best mini bike. Participants must post the progress of their build on the OMB web site at least once a month. When the mini bike is complete it must run and be in "rideable" condition. The finished mini bikes are then posted on the OMB web site and all of the members throughout the world vote on the top three mini bikes in each class. Seth restored a 1970 Fox Sprite. Each participant is responsible for taking the bike apart, assessing what needs to be replaced or repaired, searching for replacement parts, as well as placing the orders with various vendors. The student learn responsibility, how to work as a team, leadership skills, goal setting, as well as Safety in the Workplace and how to use hand tools safely and properly. The contest ran from January 31 through May 31, 2019.

Here's a short update on the latest CBI-relevant happenings from the Ohio Department of Education and the Office of Career-Technical Education:

Changes to the CTE-26 Process & Funding: Beginning fiscal year 2020 (2019-2020 school year), the process for
renewing CTE-26 applications is transitioning from renewing based on program to renewing based on expiration of
the approved program application. The old program renewal chart will no longer be used. As an example, many CBI
programs completed the FY 2019-2023 application. These programs will need to renew by March 1st, 2023 for the
FY2024-FY20228 school years.

In the most recent state budget bill (HB166) language regarding the school funding framework will "freeze" funding (included "weighted" funding for career-tech programming) at FY19 levels for FY20-21. This means that CBI programs that reported and generated CTE weighted funds in FY19 will be eligible to generate the same payments in FY20-21.

Changing Graduation Requirements: Ohio law enacted new, permanent graduation requirements that are available
for the classes of 2021 and beyond. Students entering ninth grade between July 1, 2017, and June 30, 2019, have the
option to meet the new requirements outlined for the class of 2023 and beyond or meet the requirements of the
original three pathways to graduation. Students entering ninth grade after July 1, 2019, must meet the new
requirements outlined in state law.

More guidance will be forthcoming, with regards to demonstrating competency through Career Experience and Technical Skill (which includes work-based learning). This chart outlines the options available to each graduating class, as well as a description of the requirements.

When considering graduation pathways for our students, keep in mind the following program philosophy from the Manual of Operations: "CBI is an intervention program, not a complete career field pathway. It emphasizes early awareness and recovery; students should not have the intention of remaining in the program throughout high school. The goal of the CBI program is to assist and prepare students for successful high school graduation, additional career-technical education and training, postsecondary education, and/or a meaningful career."

- CBI Annual Program Review & Risk Assessment: As a part of the Annual Program Review, we are designing and
 piloting a CBI Risk Assessment, wherein data from schools that offer CBI will be assessed, and will help to identify
 schools that will participate in on-site reviews, annually. The design of the Risk Assessment is currently ongoing;
 please anticipate more information in Spring 2020. The purpose of the Risk Assessment and the Annual Program
 Review is to provide additional supports to schools in delivering quality CBI programs for students.
- Perkins V & Equity: The federal Strengthening Career and Technical Education for the 21st Century Act (Perkins V) was signed into law on July 31st, 2018. This legislation provides new opportunities to improve CTE and enables more flexibility to meet the needs of learners, educators and employers. Perkins V has an increased focus on Equity for Special Populations because Economically Disadvantaged students and Students with Disabilities fall under the definition of Special Populations, and because these populations of students are those whom CBI primarily serves, instructors may see from leadership an increased focus on best practices for helping these students succeed.
