

### Knowledge Bowl 2021-2022

The cost is \$50 to gain access to the Knowledge Bowl website. (You can purchase the program and choose not to compete at the regional or state level.) The order form can be found by going to <u>www.cbiohio.com</u> and clicking on the Knowledge Bowl tab. The registration deadline is February 25th.

<u>Regional competitions</u>- It will be up to each region whether they host an in-person or virtual competition. In order to be eligible for state competition: regional competition results must be sent to me PRIOR TO MARCH 31ST.

<u>State Competition</u>- (The cost is \$50 PER TEAM to compete.) An in-person competition is being planned; however, the date, location and time is undetermined at this time. Once secured, registered teams will be notified. There will still be a Zoom or Google Meet option available where teams could compete live. (It would also be recorded if the date decided did not work for certain programs.) More information to follow.

Happy Fall, CBI Instructors! Here's the latest from the Office of Career Tech:

#### Funding & Grant Opportunities

- State funding for Career-Technical Education will no longer be "frozen" as of the most recent biennium budget. The Department is working to develop new funding calculations based on the newly legislated formula and anticipates a December release date. More information, including updated reports, will be forthcoming.
- Career Exploration & Awareness Funds: To support the implementation of a more careerfocused approach to education in Ohio, House Bill 110 has established funding to be used towards career awareness and exploration in each city, local, exempted village, and joint vocational school district, community school, and STEM school. A high-level <u>Guidance</u> <u>Document</u> is available here!
- Equity for Each Grant: The Office of Career-Technical Education is using the Perkins V reserve fund for the Equity for Each competitive grant and would like to announce a 3rd cohort of the grant will be open for applications November 1. The \$1.4 million in funds are available to assist applicants and the Department in identifying and promoting promising best practices for equitable supports for students in career-technical education. <u>See the application materials</u> <u>HERE!</u>


