Very simply Dr. Pinchak was a friend to CBI and was one of the most knowledgeable and caring partners for career technical education. This award will be given in his name to the CBI program that has completed a Service Learning project of high regard in the state of Ohio for the calendar year of 2024. To be eligible all projects must have been completed in 2024 any time from January to December. Applications must be completed by March 3, 2025.

Dr. James Pinchak's Bio:

Dr. Pinchak's career in education spanned 50 years. He began his career as a teacher's aide and progressed through the ranks as an academic, career & technical teacher and special needs teacher earning degrees at Miami University, Kent State University, and Bowling Green State University. Jim served over twenty years as a high-level administrator in the Ohio Department of Education before becoming Principal & Director of the Tolles Technical Center in Plain City. He became the first person promoted to the rank of Clinical Associate Professor in The Ohio State University, College of Education & Human Ecology for Career & Technical Education. His OSU graduate program was ranked first among American graduate schools for 2017, 2018 and 2019 by USNWR. He was a leading advocate for Vocational Education and Career Development known throughout the nation and the world. Jim lost his battle to cancer in 2018 but his legacy and love for career tech will always endure.
